Special Education Programs and Services

Severe Cognitive Impairment (SCI) Program Eligibility Criteria:

- Age 5 through 25 years (*Exceptions for below age 5 may be considered)
- Development at a rate of 4
 ½ or more Standard
 Deviations below the mean
 (IQ below SS=40)
- Adaptive Behavior Scale
 Functioning below SS = 40

Severe Multiple Impairment (SXI) Program Eligibility Criteria:

- Age 5 through 25 years (*Exceptions for below age 5 may be considered)
- Development at a rate of 3 or more Standard Deviations below the mean (IQ below 55) AND 1 or more of the following conditions (R340.1714):
 - Hearing Impairment
 - Visual impairment
 - Physical Impairment
 - Health Impairment
- Adaptive Behavior Scale Functioning below SS = 55

Curriculum for students with severe disabilities focuses primarily in the areas of daily living, communication, socialization, personal care, safety, recreation and leisure, LCISD special education center programs are housed at the Education and Technology Center. They are designed to provide individualized unique educational programs and services to students with "low incidence" disabilities either individually or in combination.

Students range in age from 3 through 25 years of age with moderate to severe performance challenges.

Students are referred to LCISD special education programs from local school districts when performance/achievement data indicates that the student is no longer successful in the general education curriculum and no longer benefiting from the general education setting.

Classroom programs include:

- Moderate Cognitive Impairment Programs
- Severe Multiple Impairment Program
- Severe Cognitive Impairment Programs

Moderate Cognitive Impairment (MoCI) Program Eligibility Criteria:

- Age 13 through 25 years
- Development at a rate of 3 4 ½ Standard Deviations below the mean (IQ SS=40 55)
- Adaptive Behavior Scale Functioning below SS=
 55

Curriculum for students with moderate disabilities focuses primarily in the area of personal care, independence, daily living skills, vocational skill development, community based instruction, functional academics, and employment.

Transition Services for Center Program Students

All transition-age students (16 and above) participate in skills to prepare them for employment. These skills range from pre-vocational, vocational, and employability skills. Students will explore various careers, participate in volunteer service, Career Technical Education Programs, classroom and/or community-based work experience.

Students who have the potential to obtain gainful employment upon exiting may also participate in the Business-Based Employment Skills Training (B.E.S.T.) program, which includes placement in community businesses.
